





Private Sector Innovations and Technologies for Disaster Risk Management

EVENT OVERVIEW

The majority of Turkiye's population, and critical economic sectors and industrial zones are highly exposed to earthquakes, landslides, flooding, as well as extreme weather events. According to the Disaster and Emergency Management Authority (AFAD), Turkiye had experienced 23,753 earthquakes, 107 floods, 66 big forest fires, 16 cases of heavy snowfall or blizzards, and 39 landslides in 2021, with floods and wildfires having the most devastating impacts.

Enhancing disaster risk reduction and management capability remains a priority. The involvement of nontraditional humanitarian actors such as the private sector will be key in strengthening coping capacities. It was for this reason that UNDP Turkiye and the Turkish Enterprise and Business Confederation (TÜRKONFED) launched the Connecting Business initiative (CBi) platform in the country to support the Turkish business community in disaster and climate resilience.

In this online event, the Business for Goals Platform (B4G), TÜRKONFED, and the Connecting Business initiative (CBi) will showcase examples and global best practices from the private sector on the application of innovation and technologies for disaster risk management.
